PURPOSE OF THE CHALLENGE

The principal role of an aesthetician is to perform services to enhance client physical and psychological well being through manicures, pedicures, facials, and makeup.

The challenge evaluates each competitor's readiness for employment and recognizes outstanding students for their excellence and professionalism in the aesthetics industry.

NUMBER OF STATIONS/COMPETITORS:

There are a maximum of eight (8) competitors. Spots will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis up to a maximum of two (2) per school. If all spots have not been filled before the deadline, then unfilled spots will be given on a first-come, first-serve basis from the waitlist.

COMPETITION DESCRIPTION

Manicure with Nail Art

Objective: Perform a manicure; analyze hands and fingernails; record observations on the technical chart; perform cuticle care and hand and arm massage, followed by the application of a base coat, a freehand French polish, followed by the application of the posted nail art and finished with a top coat. No color bleeding or corrections. Clean and tidy the workstation. Time allocated is 75 minutes.

Pedicure:

Objective: Perform a pedicure; analyze the skin and nails; record observations on the technical chart. Perform cuticle care, callus reduction and foot and leg massage, followed by the application of a base coat, two coats of red polish and a top coat. No color bleeding or corrections. Clean and tidy the workstation. Time allocated is 60 minutes.

Specific Facial Care

Objective: Analyze and record the specific skin care needs on a technical chart, and perform the facial based on that analysis. Complete a program of salon and home care based on the needs diagnosed. Time allocated is 75 minutes.

Fantasy Makeup

Objective: Apply fantasy makeup. Complete the technical chart prior to applying the makeup duplicating the look posted on the website. Artificial lashes, rhinestones, feathers, and other accessories may be used. Time allocated is 60 minutes.

Notice to competitors

Nail art design and make up design will be posted on the Skills Canada ~ Nova Scotia website by January 13, 2012.

PREREQUISITES – Competitors must meet the following criteria:

- be enrolled in a community college, university, or private school
- be 30 years of age or younger by January 1, 2012
- possess a Canadian Citizenship or landed immigrant status and be a resident of Nova Scotia
- have been earning post-secondary credits any time during the academic year (September to June)

EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, MATERIALS:

WORKSITE SAFETY RULES / REQUIREMENTS:

All electrical wires will be well taped on the floor. Individual circuits will be provided for each competitor's machines and equipment to prevent tripping of electrical circuit breakers. Face masks, goggles, non-latex gloves and finger cots will be provided for your safety.

In the event of a tie in scoring, the following procedure will apply:

In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest score in the most heavily weighted area of the competition will be declared the winner. If there is still a tie, the winner will be declared by a lottery draw.
