PURPOSE OF THE CHALLENGE

To enable the industry as well as observers to view the level of skills taught within the post-secondary programs and to encourage interaction between the various sectors. This relationship will ensure the skills gained by young hairstylists at all levels of training are geared to the demands of the beauty industry.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative ability in the following four tests:

1. Men's Classical Tapered- Design (executed with the scissor-over comb technique) of which the top is of the competitor's choice, following world trends. The design must integrate the tapered exterior that starts at zero into progressively longer lengths, it must flow into the interior. A beard design should be in keeping with the overall look. Top may be cut with any tool except clippers. Beard will be cut with clippers and edgers, no length guards allowed.
2. Ladies creative day technical blowdry style with color enhancement. The cut, and style must follow the world trend in this category, with coloration of the stylist's choice however should not be extreme.
3. A color award will be given based solely on coloration. It will be based on placement, clean application, thorough application, and color choice- 3 colors must be visible in the design.

No written test will be administered. The theoretical knowledge will be relevant in the performance of the practical tests.

Career related Skills exhibited:

1. Haircutting – scissors, razor, texturizer, clippers (only for the beard design, taper will be performed scissor over comb, tapering from 0 at hairline into lengths that get progressively longer.
2. Hairstyling – blow-drying, use of products, amount and type to achieve desired look.
3. Hair Color and Lightening– semi-permanent and permanent colors, and lighteners of competitors choice.
4. Beard Designing- Using clippers, edgers razors, all tools allowed for the beard.

EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, SUPPLIES, CLOTHING

Contestants must provide for competition

- Clean and comfortable work attire as would be worn by professionals working in a modern hair salon as

well as any protective clothing – smocks, color aprons, gloves.

- Closed toed shoes with hosiery must be worn at all times
- Smocks and gloves must be worn when coloring
- Their own working tools; water bottle, towels, cape, cutting implements, combs, brushes, clips, blow dryer, gloves, timers. See attached list of supplies.
- Coloring products and all tools necessary for application.
- Earrings are optional and may be put on after the time is called.
- Either, one mannequin head support (with extensions, a or tripod will be supplied- 1 per competitor- it will depend on the # of competitors as to whether or not, tri-pods will be available.
- Contestants should come prepared and should not have to borrow supplies from others
- Only one electrical tool may be plugged at a time (a maximum of 2500 watts can be used per electrical outlet)

Supplied by committee:

Each contestant will be provided with a table, mirror, non-hydraulic chair an electrical outlet. **MANNEQUINS WILL BE PROVIDED THROUGH SPONSORSHIP FROM Maritime Beauty Supply and Dannyco. Many thanks to our sponsors.**

Two competition mannequins – one ladies- 928 Level 11 Female Dannyco head, and Male# 1 Dannyco head with full beard. You can go on the Dannyco website to see the mannequins.

POINT BREAKDOWN – International 30pt. system-Hair Arts and Sciences Judging Panel Of Canada.

- All judging will be performed according to the criteria
- For each test in case of a tie, judges will be called back to the competition floor to break the tie. The contestants with the highest combined points from the two tests will be the winner, the second highest mark will be placed second and the third highest mark will be placed third. Should there be a tie, the tabulator will look to the Ladies contest to see the highest score and that person will be declared the winner. Should that also result in a tie then the tabulator will look at the highest score from the men's, and that person shall be declared the winner.
- Demerits may be given for any rule infractions- see below.

Any communication between audience and competitor during contests times may be seen as coaching and could cause demerits to be awarded or disqualification

Penalty points

Length – 1 point

Color – 1 point

Use of tools – 1 point

Out of category – 1 point

Coaching

- first warning will incur 1-5 points
- second warning will be disqualification

No head sets, walkmans, portable CD players or cellular phones allowed.

No technical support such as formulas, pictures, drawings, notes, etc. In some contests a picture could be provided, in that instant the competitor will be allowed to have the picture for the duration of the test.

SCORE 30 point International Judging System

Excellent – 30 points

Great – 29 points

Very Good – 28 points

Good – 27 points

Average– 26 points

Below Average–25 -22 points

Poor- 21 or lower

Any competitor may compete in just one of the two competitions, however they would not be eligible to win a medal, only competitors competing in both and receiving a combined score will be able to win a medal and move on to the National Skills competition. Any competitor is eligible for prizes in either contest, should prizes be allotted. The first place winner will go on to represent Nova Scotia at the Canada Skills Competition in Edmonton, Alberta. As this is a World qualifying year, should the Nova Scotia competitor win the Gold medal they will go on to compete in Germany at the World Skills in 2013. Age restrictions apply to both National and World Events. Under the age of 21 on qualifying, and during the year in which the World's are held they cannot be over the age of 22.
